With a background in sex crimes prosecution and Title IX investigations, Rebecca Leitman Veidlinger provides Title IX compliance consulting, investigative services and sexual misconduct training to educational institutions nationwide. She has authored numerous articles on issues related to campus sexual misconduct for a variety of national publications, and has spoken across the country at conferences of prosecutors, academic administrators, athletic coaches, fraternal organizations, and forensic nurses. Institutions of higher education and K-12 school districts rely on Rebecca to provide experience-based, high-quality external investigations into allegations of sexual misconduct. Selected in early 2015 by Michigan State University (“MSU”) to lead its creation of, and transition to, a free-standing civil rights investigations unit, Rebecca served MSU for eight months as its Interim Deputy Title IX Coordinator. She previously conducted investigations and provided Title IX and sexual misconduct training to hundreds of students, staff and faculty as a Title IX Investigator at the University of Michigan.

A trained forensic interviewer, Rebecca also served as the sex crimes and domestic violence prosecutor in Monroe County, Indiana, where she handled hundreds of cases of adult sexual assault, domestic violence, and child sexual abuse. Rebecca has worked for large and small law firms, and began her distinguished legal career as a federal judicial clerk for the Honorable Harold H. Greene of the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia. She is a graduate of the Georgetown University Law Center (J.D.), the George Washington University (M.A., Public Policy and Women’s Studies), and McGill University (B.A.).
