Collaboration across Justice Systems: Policing and Prosecution

July 17, 2019, 1:00–5:00 p.m.

Relationships between law enforcement and prosecutors have long been critical for ensuring public safety by identifying individuals causing disproportionate harm to local communities and focusing scarce resources on the prosecution and reclamation of those individuals. However, conflicting agency resources, needs, and priorities and outside political and public pressures can strain these relationships. This Executive Session, in partnership with the National District Attorney's Association (NDAA), will review challenges that law enforcement and prosecutors face for establishing and maintaining local and federal collaborative partnerships with each other and with external stakeholders. The session will also include a discussion of effective law enforcement-prosecution strategies used across the nation and in programs such as the Project Safe Neighborhoods initiative, related to collaborative violent and gun crime investigation and prosecution approaches, working with federal law enforcement partners, communication and accountability mechanisms, and community engagement. The session will include leading practitioners and researchers in the field.
